From there we travel to Kilkenny and Waterford and visit the House of Crystal. Now on the West side of the Island we travel North to Limerick for 2 days of visiting the Cliffs of Mohr & Galway. 



We continue to work with our insurance company and have engaged professionals to assist us in the valuation of our buildings and their contents. This will assist us in receiving all that we are entitled to under our policy.

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
