Several dignitaries and members of the media were present.

Superman, Spiderman, and Transformers Bumblebee entertained the kids and must have posed for over 100 photos. Visiting with our kids and their parents was truly the highlight of the day. The mother of a young lady who had been severely burned wanted to thank us for "fixing her daughter, the other kids don't make fun of her any more". During remarks the Shrine was complimented for transforming the lives of so many children, and being Super Hero's to so many patients and families. When I was asked to speak, I could only turn that around and thank the kids for being such great examples to all of us by enduring the treatments associated with their conditions. A week later I attended the Sacramento Hospital Burn Clinic in Tijuana where the patients are evaluated for further treatment. Outer Guard Saul Lopez coordinated with government officials in Culiacan and was able to secure a bus bringing 34 patients and chaperones on a 24 hour bus ride to be seen by our Doctors and then turn around and make the 24 hour trip back. These are just two examples of the type of work our Noble Brothers to the South are doing in support of our Shrine Mission. Many thanks and Congratulations to all of them.

Our Spring Ceremonial was exceptional, the Directors Staff, Stage Crew, Cast, and oh yes the Oriental Band put on a fantastic performance. 

Oriental Guide

Hello, Fellow Nobles,

We are Shriners. We're proud of our organization and our part in the Masonic family. We participate in Shrinedom's many activities and rightfully call ourselves members of the world's greatest philanthropy. But who are we, really, when it comes down to the numbers? I want to give you an update on who we really are as Shriners, and you can help continue to determine the role Al Bahr has in it. First, we are a fraternity with a philanthropy. Sometimes our great history gets lost with the reversal of roles when some say that we are a philanthropy with a fraternity. At my recent Oriental Guide school, my fellow 165 Oriental Guides from Shriners centers all around the world, (out of about 195 Shriners centers) and I had this discussion, and held a mock court on which were we? The decision was rooted in tradition that we are a fraternity that has a philanthropy. So, what does that mean?

This is us. You and me and our fellow Nobles. We ARE Shiners Hospitals. We own and operate 23 hospitals, located in 16 states, three countries, and in five different time zones. Our 2014 operating expenses totaled \$480 million for just last year. Our daily average census last year was 141.5 children in beds for inpatient services. In 2014, our total census was 51,643 inpatients in our hospitals. Now, hold on! We ALSO serviced last year alone, an additional 287,000 outpatient encounters. That is more than 786 children per day we serviced around the world just in the outpatient category. Since I divided by 365 days in a year, including all holidays and weekends, if I just divided by weekdays, it amounts to 1103 children seen on an average weekday!! That means, on average, Our Al Bahr Samaritan drivers, taking 15 children per day to the Los Angeles hospital, serviced 1.4 percent of the total daily worldwide international Shriners Hospital outpatient load last year, day in and day out. I will need to add to that, the inpatient transportation load which I do not have. We owe our Samaritan Drivers a large debt of gratitude: they make all of us Shiners look good!! I did not even mention those children we need to fly to OUR hospitals for services or that need special travel arrangements on an acute or regular basis.

As I am writing this on early May, we are preparing to go to the May 27 groundbreaking of the new Los Angeles hospital construction in Pasadena. So when you receive this on June 1, that construction should be underway. My fellow Nobles, we have a lot to be proud of, and as Southern California Shriners, even more so, with the advent of our new replacement hospital. I will write more later to continue to update you. We ARE AI Bahr Shriners!!
