The Director' Staff once again exceeded all expectations with their artistic and skillful construction of the hoosegow, cut-out figures for photos, and the whole bottom floor of the Shrine. Thanks also to Ray and Annette Barnes for their western saddles, spurs, and other decorations. Those of you who missed the two beautiful horses out back missed some beauties; some of you even got to mount up! The food, Western style of course, was prepared by first-timers, "That Boy Good" or "T.B.G.", and was fantastic! The turnout was better than anticipated for a summer event, but even more importantly, the spirit (not spirits) was high and a good time echoed by all. Fun and Fellowship was abundantly present.

August 11th was our stated meeting honoring the officers of the Scottish Rite bodies a sumptuous meal prepared by the Islanders, and an address by Illustrious Sir Ed Collins, PP, who presented update information on the Shrine Children's Medical Center at Pasadena and progress being made in Tijuana regarding the delivery of and future progress and changes soon to be made in that area, resulting in better service to the residents in the affected regions.

The Shriners' Annual Imperial Council session in Daytona Beach was attended well and many items were disposed of and proposed changes announced. Al Bahr Shrine was granted its request to withdraw from the Western Shrine Association as the Nobility voted, and five-to-six other temples voted to withdraw from their respective associations. Despite Shrine rumors, a shrine temple is NOT required to belong to any association.

The Ladies Tea held on August 26th was another highly successful and ornately planned event which makes milliners and dressmakers very happy. Rumor has it they all had a marvelous and congenial time, and raised needed funds for future donations. September 9th is the Grand Master's Visit to San Diego at the Scottish Rite in conjunction with the annual Mason of the Year Awards. Support your Blue Lodge and brothers if possible.

September 21st is the anniversary of the founding of the Shriners in New York City in 1871.

When I took my obligation as a Master Mason, incidentally with my three younger brothers, I recalled the value my own father attached to that Order. But I had no idea that I would be added to the company of the Father of our country and 12 other members of the Order who also served as President of the United States of America. Masonic principles – internal, not external – and our Oder's vision of duty to country and acceptance of God as Supreme Being and guiding light have sustained me during my years of government service.

#### Chaplain's Message - Abe Ravitch

I've always been fascinated with the history of religion. Here's a short timeline from the 1st to 5th centuries.

4bce-c.30/33: CE-The life of Jesus of Nazareth, the central figure of Christianity.

31-36: The death of John the Baptist.

50-62: The first Christian Council was convened in Jerusalem.

70: The Siege of Jerusalem, the Destruction of the Temple and the rise of Rabbinic Judaism.

220: Manichaean Gnosticism was formed by the prophet Mani.

250: Some of the oldest parts of the Ginza Rba, a core text of Mandaean Gnosticism, were written.

250–900: Classic Mayan step pyramids were constructed.

300: The oldest known version of the Tao Te Ching was written on bamboo tablets.[citation needed]

313: The Edict of Milan decreed religious toleration in the Roman empire.

325: The first ecumenical council (the Council of Nicaea) was convened to attain a consensus on doctrine through an assembly representing all Christendom. It established the original Nicene Creed and fixed the date of Easter. It also confirmed the primacy of the Sees of Rome, Alexandria and Antioch, and granted the See of Jerusalem a position of honour.

c.350: The oldest record of the complete biblical texts (the Codex Sinaiticus) survives in a Greek translation called the Septuagint, dating to the 4th century CE.

380: Theodosius I declared Nicene Christianity the state religion of the Roman Empire.




