#### Chaplain's Message - Greg S. Maizlish

The month of April is among the most auspicious of the year with the religious holidays of Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Passover and Easter. The books of Mark, Matthew, and Luke all describe the Last Supper as a Passover Seder (Matthew 26:17-30, Mark 14:12-31, Luke 22:1-19.) Biblical scholars disagree primarily due to the missing traditional Seder elements of the preparation of the Paschal (Lamb) sacrifice; explicit reference to matzoh (unleavened bread), maror (bitter herbs) and charoses (sweet fruits and nuts); the Mah Nishtanah (why is this night different than all other nights?) four questions; and the father's narration of the Passover (Pesach) story. Passover marks the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt by Moses and the Lord Almighty as told in the book of Exodus, which informs us that ten plagues were visited upon the Egyptians and their Pharaoh. The last of them was the death of all Egyptian first-born. The Israelites put the blood of a slaughtered spring lamb on the doorposts of their homes so that the plague would pass over their homes. We may never know the definitive answer to the question of whether the Last Supper was a Passover Seder but the possibility underscores the roots of Judaeo-Christianity.


