MEET YOUR CLUB

SAMARITAN DRIVER'S

Chartered in 1996 by Potentate Paul Robison, the Samaritan Drivers was organized to transport Children and Family to and from the Los Angeles Shriners Hospital for Children. Noble Fred Wright was the founding President and there was 62(!) charter members. Each member can be a Driver, a "shotgun" Driver or an interpreter during the trips with the Children and Families.

During the first four years of operation the club transported over 6800 patients and over 6500 adults to the Los Angeles Shriners Hospital with over 1040 van trips and over 39,000 Samaritan Drivers hours logged. This was all accomplished with two vans Al Bahr has refreshed over the years. WOW!

Around 2018 the Los Angeles Hospital was retired and we moved to a new home, the Shriners for Children Medical Center Pasadena. A normal day for a Samaritan Driver involves meeting at the Shrine Center at 4:30 AM to pick up the vans and patient paperwork. Then it's off to the border or a US pickup location to pickup "our kids" and their guardians for a trip up to the Shriners for Children Medical Center Pasadena.

The Samaritan Drivers get the kids checked in for the day and then relax at the site and wait for the green light for a return. Usually late in the afternoon the kids are finished for the day to return home and the drivers make the return trip with the kids and then returns back to the Shrine Center, usually by 5:30PM.

A long, but a very rewarding day.

While we usually associate the Samaritan Drivers with the Classic Van drivers, we have other Nobles that are Samaritan Drivers and do other tasks such as stay at the border on both sides to do paperwork and ensure the kids get across the border both ways, send kids via airplane to other Shriners locations such as the Shriners Hospital in Northern California or any of the other Hospital locations such as St. Louis and Boston. This is also an invaluable part of the club operation for our kids!

As we entered 2020 Shriners International has moved the Tijuana Shriners Clinic into a whole floor in Hospital Los Angeles in Tijuana and we are all waiting for the Grand Opening Event but they are already seeing kids! We expect the need for driving our kids will start to slow down but will still be required and for sure we will still be sending kids to Northern California and other Shriners Hospitals.

The Samaritan Drivers Club continues on with its services to our kids and their families. The Samaritan Drivers are always looking for new members and you do not have to be a daily driver to belong to the club. There are other roles you can help with. 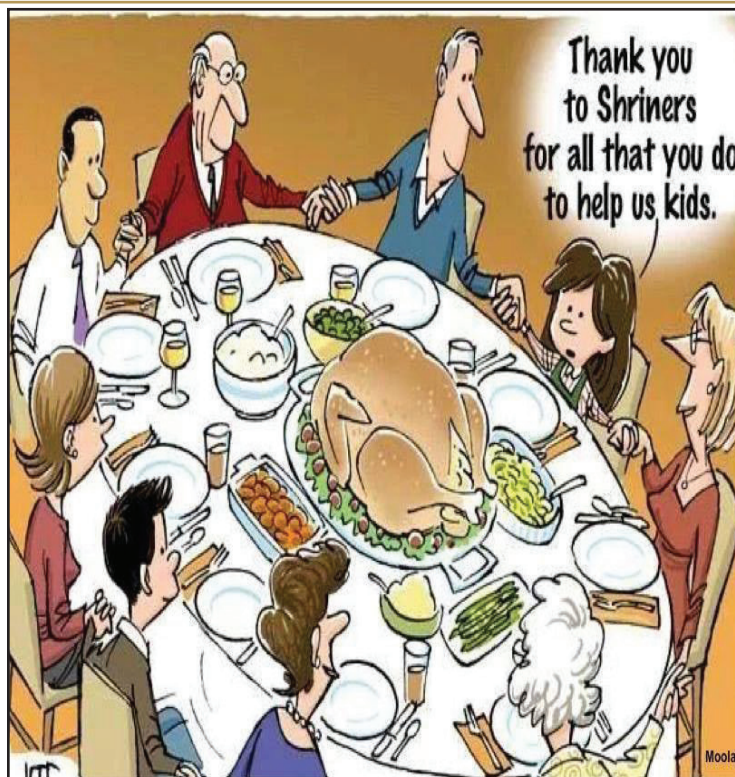
